Mara Dierssen is medical doctor (1985) and PhD in Neurobiology (1989). She heads the Cellular and Systems Neurobiology group of the Systems Biology program at the Centre for Genomic Regulation (CRG) in Barcelona. Member of the Academia Europaea and the European DANA Allianze for the Brain Distinguished Alumni University of Cantabria, and Honorary Member of the College of Medicine. She was Associated Professor of the University of Cantabria and the University Ramon Llull in Barcelona.
