

Yukihiko Hamada

Yukihiko Hamada is a policy analyst at the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD), where he leads various projects on political finance, lobbying and public sector integrity within the Directorate of Public Governance and Territorial Development . Yuki has a wide range of public sector experience both in Japan and the UK. Prior to joining the OECD, he worked as a political analyst at the British Embassy in Tokyo, playing a leading role in lobbying the Japanese politicians for a number of policy issues regarding regional security, nuclear energy and human rights. He also worked as a press attaché at the Embassy of Japan in the UK, integrating media handling and event planning into strategic lobbying campaigns. He handled the press relations for the Japanese delegation at the G20 Summit in London. He was a postdoctoral research fellow at University College London (UCL), where he conducted research on the impact of Japanese business lobbying within the EU policy making process. Yuki holds a PhD in Political Science and a Master of Science degree in Public Policy from UCL, and a Bachelor's degree in Politics from University of Essex. He has published articles/chapters on transnational business-government relationship in several academic journals and books including the Journal of European Public Policy and The Oxford Handbook of Business and Government (2010, Oxford University Press).
